Gol. Hooper, from the Committee of Grievances, delivers to Mr. Speaker the following Report, viz.

By the Committee of Grievances, and Courts of Juffice, June 5, 1747 N Pursuance of the Order of Reserence, of your Honograble House, in Relation to the Petition of the Rev. Mr. Thomas Chafe, Rector of St. Paul's Parist, in Baltimere County, your Committee have procured a View of the bond, passed by the said Chase, to Mrs. Jeanette Bourdillion, for Twenty six Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, upon which a Judgment hath been rendered in the County and Provincial Courts, and Execution thereupon illned, and for which your Committee are informed the said Chase is now confined in Prison, and has been for some Time past according to the Tenor of the said Petition; a Copy of which Bond is hereunto annexed (marked No 1.) Themse Bladen, Esq.; late Governor of this Province, was pleased to fend to your Committee, the Deposition made by him. hereunto annexed (marked No. 2.) to which, and the Depositions of Eamund Jenings, Esq; his Lording's Secretary of State, and John Raitt, subscribing Evidences to the said Bond, hereunto anaexed (marked 3 and 4.) your Committee pray Leave to refer. It appears to your Committee, by the said Depositions, that the said Bond was taken before the Induction of the said Chase, in to the said St. Paul's Parish; and that the said Bond was a Consideration for such Induction, and the taking thereof justified by the said Thomas Bladen, Esq. and his Lordship's Secretary who was of Council (as he declares) with him on the Occasion. Your Committee humbly presume to represent to your Honourable House, That by an Ast of Allembly of this Province, emittaled, An Ast for the Establishment of Resident gious Worship in this Province, according to the Church of England; and for the Maintenance of Ministers, Provi is made for faithful and able Ministers, labouring in the Work of the Gospel, to come and reade in this Propriete. by a Tax on the People, and Inhabitants thereof, and payable to the Minister of each respective Parish, presented, inducted, or appointed by the Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being. That the People of this Province, His Majesly's liege oubjects, are the Founders and Endowers of all the Churches within the same; and that the aforesaid implied Power of Presentation and Induction, is at most but a Trust.

That the Sale of such Presentations or Inductions, is a Discouragement to learned and faithful able Clergymen, to come inte, or reside within this Province, contrary to the Canons of our Holy Church, and the Statute Laws of our Mother Country, highly indecent and unbecoming, brings Scandal on Gou's holy and truly Christian Religion, and is greatly injurious to the People. That in particular, the Parithioners of St. Paul's Parish, have been deprived of the Comforts of the Administration of the said Thomas Chair, in his Functions, as a Clergyman, in the said Parish, ever sace the 21st D y of November, 1746, the Time on which he was first executed and imprisoned on the faid Bond and Judgmunt, notwithflanding they are chargeable with, and pay the Taxaforefaid.

Your Committee humbly conceive, such Actings and Doings is a great Grievance, and very much tends to lessen the Opinion of the People of his Lord hip the Lord Proprietary, and alienate their Winds and Affections from his Lordibip, his good Rule and Government; but is humbly submitted to the Consideration of your Honourable House.
