We also find a Deed of Gift from Mary Stevenson, of Baltimore County, to Elizabeth Barney, her Heirs, and Affigus, dated the 16th Day of January, 1717, for the same Land, and acknowledged the same Day before the same two Justices, but not recorded. We likewise find a Receipt from the said Morgan Murray, to William Barney, in the World Color of the Barney, the William Barney, the Will in the Words following, viz. June the 1 Day 1723 Receive of William Barney In ful of all Account Bils bonus and Nots what some bath bin past One Account of One Hundred and Fifety Akers of Land I say Receive per me Morgan Morray Θ

We further find the Deposition of Henry Satyr, taken the 6th of June, 1747, before Samuel Onings, one of the Justices of Baltimere County, wherein he makes Outh, That to the best-of his Know ege, a certain I ratt of Land, called Morgan's Delight, which was conveyed to Mary Stewenson and Elizabeth Burney, and her Heirs, was fully paid for ; and knows of no further Demand being made for the faid Land, these twenty Years, or more. All which is most numbly submitted to the Consideration of your Honourable House.

On motion of a Member, that Leave be given to bring in a Bill to prevent the raising of Swine and Geele in Princess Anne Town, in Somerset County; Leave is given.
