"This is to say, 200 Acres thereof, I give unto my Daughter *Elizabeth*, and to the Heirs of her Body for ever; and for and on Default of such Issue, then to my Daughter *Mary*, which God was pleased to bless me with, by my second and present Marriage, to her, and her Heirs for ever." Which 200 Acres, your Committee presume to be Part of a Tract of Land, called *St. Patrick's Hill*, mentioned in the said Petition. And we likewise believe, that ~~she~~ the Wife of *Jacob* is Daughter and Heirs of the aforesaid *Elizabeth*, Daughter of the aforesaid *Robert Price*. And lastly, we find that the Tract of Land, called *Waidstone's Enlargement*, patented for 100 Acres; and that Part of the Tract of Land, called *Waidstone*, measuring 112 Acres, according to the Courses mentioned in the aforesaid Petition, (leaving out the Words, two Degrees South, in the fifth Course; which we apprehend to be a Mistake) by the information of *Mr. James Smallwood*, is better in Quality, and of greater Value, than the aforesaid 200 Acres Part of *St. Patrick's Hill*: All which is humbly submitted to the Consideration of your Honourable House.

The Bill, entitled, *A Supplementary Act, to the Act, entitled, An Act for laying out the Town a-new, commonly called Snow-Hill Town, in Somerset County*; was read the second Time, and will pass: Sent to the Upper House, by *Col. Henry*, and *Col. Scarborough*.
