Read the second Time, and will e pass, with the following Amendments: In the 12th Line of the 1st Page, · after the Word Bonds, infert these Words, which shall be taken or executed after the End of this Session of Assembly; from the Word Powers, in the last Line of the same Page, seave out all the remaining Part of that Clause; after the Word supported, in the 11th Line of the 3d Page, leave out these Words, and ' that by no Interpretation of Laws the same should suffer; from the Word and, in the 1st Line of the 4th Page, to the Word be, in the 3rd Line, to be left out; after the Word on, in 6th Line of the same Page, to the Word Sureties, ' in 9th Line, to be left out, and the following Words inserted, What shall be ' really due on such Bond or Bonds, and the following Proviso to be added at ' the End of the Bill; Provided always, that nothing berein contained, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any Action or Suit, where the Plaintiff ' shall give Directions to any Attorney or Attorneys, to commence several Actions, ' or where a Titling or Titlings shall be sent to the said Office or Offices, for the I fuing of several Writs on one and the same Bond.
