Which Bill was accordingly indorsed, "Read with the Amendments agreed on by the Conferrees of both Houses, and passed for Ingrossing.

The Bill, entituled *An Act to prevent the Act of Limitation taking Place, or being pleadable in the Case of Treasurers Bonds*; was read the second Time, and will pass; and being so indorsed, was sent to the Upper House, by Major Henry, and Mr. Dulany.

The Bill, entituled *An Act for building a new Court House for Cæcil County*; was read the second Time, and will not pass.

George Plater, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker the Bill, entituled *An Act to prevent the Evils arising from the entering up Judgments upon Bonds, commonly called Judgment Bonds, &c.* Indors'd, 'By the Upper House of Assembly, July 7, 1747. Read the second Time, and will pass, with the following Amendments: In the 12th Line of the 1st Page, after the Word *Bonds*, insert these Words, *which shall be taken or executed after the End of this Session of Assembly*; from the Word *Powers*, in the last Line of the same Page, leave out all the remaining Part of that Clause; after the Word *supported*, in the 11th Line of the 3d Page, leave out these Words, *and that by no Interpretation of Laws the same should suffer*; from the Word *and*, in the 1st Line of the 4th Page, to the Word *be*, in the 3d Line, to be left out; after the Word *on*, in 6th Line of the same Page, to the Word *Sureties*, in 9th Line, to be left out, and the following Words inserted, *What shall be really due on such Bond or Bonds*, and the following Proviso to be added at the End of the Bill; *Provided always, that nothing herein contained, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any Action or Suit, where the Plaintiff shall give Directions to any Attorney or Attorneys, to commence several Actions, or where a Titling or Tittlings shall be sent to the said Office or Offices, for the suing of several Writs on one and the same Bond.*
