By the Lower House of Assembly, July 8, 1747.

May it please your Honours,

THIS House concurs with your Honours, with all the Amendments proposed by your Honours, to the Bill, entituled *An Act for raising Three Pence Sterling per Hoghead on all Tobacco to be exported, for purchasing Arms and Ammunition, and for an immediate Supply of Arms for the Defence of this Province, except the Salary to the Armourer, which this House is willing shall be settled at 25 Pounds Sterling per Annum, to be paid by the Treasurers out of the Money that will be raised by this Act; and the Duration of the Bill, which this House cannot agree to alter: We therefore desire your Honours to pass the Bill accordingly.* Signed per Order, M. THIS House hath agreed to the Amendments to the Bill, entituled *An Act for raising Three Pence Sterling per Hoghead, on all Tobacco to be exported, for purchasing Arms and Ammunition, and for an immediate Supply of Arms for the Defence of this Province; as proposed in your Message of this Day, by Mess.
