Daniel Dulany, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker the following Message, viz

By the Upper House of Assembly, July 11, 1747.

Gentlemen,

WE cannot agree to the Amendment you propose to the Bill for dividing *Prince George's County*; because we are apprehensive that it would be inconvenient to the very People whom the Legislature intends to favour and indulge: For, should the Time be limited as you propose, it may possibly happen, that his Lordship may not receive the Bill Time enough to consider it, and intimate his Dissent to it, in case he shall think fit to dissent, before some Progress may be made in carrying it into Execution; which would be attended with the same ill Consequences mentioned in our former Message. Whereas, if it be left in the Manner we have proposed, an Opportunity may possibly happen for his Lordship to signify his Pleasure in so short a Time, that the Court House and Prison may be built before *December*, 1748, and the People receive the Advantage designed them long before that Time; which we hope you will consider, and that you will agree to the Amendment, as proposed by this House.
