Hat the House having Resolved itself into a Grand Committee of the whole House, proceeded to take into their Consideration the Remonstrance and Petition of fundry the lahabitants of Prince George's County, and the Report from the Committee of Grievance relating to the Justices of Prince George's County making ansOrder of County, for saleshing the Quantity of one hundred thousand Pounds of Tobacco, on the taxable Inhabitants of the County aforesaid, for repairing the Court House of the said County, and for levying the Quantity of fifty-one thousand nine hundred and forty four Pounds of Tobacco thereof on the Innabitants of the faid County, together with the Sheriff's Salary, accordingly: And, that Committee, after a full Hearing, and on the most mature Consideration, had Refoland That the making the aforesaid Order, or Rule of Court, for assessing the Quantity of one nundred thousand Pounds of Tobacco upon the taxable Innabitants of Prince George's County aforefaid, and that the levying the Quantity of fifty-one thousand nine hundred and forty four Pounds of Tobacco, and the Sheriff's Salary, for repairing the Court Frouse aforesaid, is illegal and oppressive, and not warranted by the AA of Asimoly entireled, An Aa improvering the Commissioners of the County Courts to lowy and raise Tobasco, for destaying the necessary Charges of their Counties and Parishes, or by any other Law whatsoever.

On Consideration of the Report from the grand Committee of the whole House, the Question was put, that the House contain therewith, Resolved accordingly.
