Col. King, from the Committee appointed to settle a Division of Stepney! Parish, in Somerset County, delivers to Mr. Speaker the following Report; viz.

N Obedience to an Order of your House for dividing Stepney Parish, in Somerset County, your Committee reports as follows:

That if the fouth Side of Wiccomico River and Creek, to the Head thereof, be taken into Somerfee Parish as prayed; then your Committee humbly recommend the Division of Stepney Parish to begin at the Mouth of Barren Creek, thence running with the faid Creek and Branch to Venable's Saw mill, thence along the main Road to Spring Hill Chapel, leaving the faid Chapel to the northward of the faid Line, thence along the faid Road and bounded thereby to the late John Cadwell's Saw mill, thence up the main Stream of that Branch by Rolinfon Lingo's that now is, thence along the Bridle Path now in Use, which leads to Saww bill Town as far as Stepney Parish extends; all on the uppermost Side of said Creek, Road; and Branch, to be the new Parish, and now to be called But if the Prayer of Somerset Parish, for that Part of Stepney lying on the fouth Side of Wicomico River and Creek as aforesaid, should not take Effect; then your Committee humbly recommend the Division of said Parish to begin at the Mouth of Rushice Creek, then with the said Creek and main Branch until it intersects the main Road that leads to Breed Creek and the Upper Ferry of Wicomico River; thence along the main Road, and bounded thereby, to the late John Caldwell's Saw-mill, thence up the main Stream of said Branch to Robinson Lingo's, thence along the Bridle Path now in 1160 that leads to Saw-Lill Towns as for a Committee of the said and the s dle Path now in Use that leads to Snow hill Town as far as Stepney Parish extends, all on the upperment Side of said Creek, Roads, and Branches to be the new Parist; and all the Lands that lie on the lower-most Side of said Creek, Roads, and Branches, to be and remain Stepney Parish.
