On a further Consideration of the Inspection-Law, the Question was put, Whether the Desiciencies occasioned from the Execution of the Inspection-Law, shall be made good by the respective County, where a Desiciency hath urisen or shall arise; or by the Public? Resolved, That the Desiciency be made good by the respective County where the Desiciency shall happen.
