In the Council Chamber,

386 Muskets and Carbines, 71 Pistols, 20 Trumpers, 8 Drums, 74 Swords, 44 Cartouch Boxes and Belts, 49 Hasberts and Pikes, 46 Buckets and Slings, 50 Sword Blades, and 18 Daggers.

Your Committee observe, that the 386 Muskets, also the 14 Pistols, mentioned in the above Report, to ontward Appearence are clean; but upon examining the Insides and Locks of some of them, do find, that

they are runy and out of Order, and could not be fired in case of an Emergency.

Your Committee further find, that fince the last Session, there has been delivered out of the Council Chamber, per Order of his Excellency Samuel Ogle, Esq; two Trampets; viz. one to Capt. William Hopper of Succen Anne's County, and the other to Capt. Richard Harwood of Anne Arandel County.
