Holliers, 144 Swords, 25 Bayonets, 65 Sword Belts, 16 o'd Cutlasses, 6 new Drums, 14 ritols, 4 Chests of Maich, and 15 rair of Drum-slicks.——In the Council Chamber, 386 Musicets and Carbines, 71 Pistols, 20 Trumpets, 8 Drums, 74 Swords, 44 Cartouch Boxes and Belts, 49 Halberts and Pikes, 46 Backets and Slings, 50 Sword Blades, and 18 Daygers.—Your Committee observe, that the 386 Musicus, also the 14 Palois, mentioned in the above Report, to outward Appearance are clean; but upon examining the Infides and Locks of some of them, do find, that they are rully and out of Order, and tould not be fised in case of an Emergency.

Upon Confideration whereof, we conceive, the Armourer, or Person who hath the Charge of the same, and receives a confiderable yearly Salary, is negligent in his Duty. Therefore, we pray that your Excellency will take the fame into your Confideration, and do therein as to your Excellency shall feem meet.
