If you should have any Objection to raising the Money in the public-Levy, I shall very readily join with you in any other Method that may be thought easier to the Ceople.

As to finishing the House for the Use of the Governor, I shall be always for your pressing you to go on faster than you may apprehend it convenient for the Country: However, I cannot help thinking it would be but good Occording to fedure the Building and other Materials from the injury they must receive, by being expoled in such a Manner to the Weather.

The Hopfe may perhaps by forme be thought top large; but confidering the Goodness of the Building. and that it is all under one Root, it may probably in the main be less expensive to the Public, than a timaller Houle about the, with the necessary Offices according to it.

The House adjourns 'til Tomorrow Morning at 9 o' Clock.
