Ordered, That Mr. Jonas Green do print Copies of the Bill entituled, An Ast for processioning Lands in order to perpetuate the Bounds thereof, and fur other Purposes therein mentioned; and the Bill entituled, An Ast for the hetter Encouragement of Learning within this Province: And that he cause one to be delivered to his Excellency the Governor, and to each Member of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly; and that he likewise print the said Bills in one or more of his Weckly News-Papers; and lay his Account before the next Assembly.

A Bill entituled, An Act to impower James Sterling, Rector of St. Paul's Parish in Kent County, to convey two Iracts of Land, the one called Hud-de's Right, the other called Rushmore, lying in Kent County aforesaid,

was read the first Time, and ordered to lie on the Table.
