Your Committee is informed, that the said Mr. Nathaniel Wright was qualified and acted as an Inspector the last Year, and was rechose for this Year, and still continues to deliver out Tobacco by him inspected. Your Committee is of Opinion, that he is precluded from a Seat in your Honourable House, by the Act entitled, An Ast for amending the Staple of Tobacco, for proventing Frauds in his Majesty's Customs, and for the Limitation of Officers Fees.
