Your Committee have computed the Interest of the above Sum of 310 1. 14 s. 2 d. 2 q. 2t 5 per Cent. per Annum; which added to the Principal, amounts to 491 l. 18s. 4d. 2q. By which it appears, that she faid Col. George Gale has overpaid the Debt of the aforesaid Levin Gale, the Sum of 8 l. 1 s. 7 d. 2 q. Your ommittee are therefore humbly of Opinion, that the said Sum of 81. 1 s. 7 d. 2 q. be repaid the aforesaid ol. George Gale.
