 All which Petitions were here read and granted.
 Mr. Gowane brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a Bill entituled, *An Act for suppressing certain Ware-houses therein mentioned*; which was read the first and second Time by an especial Order, and will pass; and was sent to the Upper House by Mr. Gowane and Mr. Reynolds.
 On Motion, the Question was put, Whether this House will agree to the following Proposals, made by the Conterees of the Upper House, *viz. That the Commissioners, to be appointed in Case of a Deficiency, be appointed in the same Manner and in the same Proportion as usual, by both Houses, in laying the Public Levy, or Not?* Resolved in the Negative.
 On Motion, the Question was put, and accordingly Resolved, That the Number of Commissioners, to be appointed, be Five of the Upper House, and Twelve of the Lower House of Assembly.
 Major Hall, from the Committee of Laws, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a Bill entituled, *An Act to empower the Justices of the several County Courts, to make Provision for the late Inhabitants of Nova-Scotia, and for regulating their Conduct*; which was read the first Time, and ordered to lie on the Table.
