That for defraying the Expence attending the Raising, Paying, and Supporting, 100 Men, Officers included, to be added to the Garrison of Fort *Frederick*, under the Command of Captain *Joshua Beall*, from September 1757, until April the 10th 1757, and for Supporting Two old Companies, consisting of 200 Men, Officers included, from 10th February to the 10th April 1757, the Agents aforesaid have received from the Commissioners or Trustees aforesaid, the Sum of 3400*l.* of which Sum only the Sum of 2833*l.* 12*s.* 1½*d.* has been expended; which leaves a Balance in the Hands of the Agents unapplied, of 566*l.* 7*s.* 10½*d.* as per following State of that Account, *to wit*,
