to satisfy the Owners of the Horsesthat were hired to bring the Cherokees hither. I hope you will take this Matter into Consideration, and do therein as you shall think reasonable. HOR. SHARPE.

Which was Read and Assented to, and Signed, by Order of the House, by the Honourable Speaker. Ordered, That Mr. Govane and Mr. Plater do acquaint his Excellency the Governor, That this House hath prepared an Address, to be presented to him, and desires to know when and where he will please to receive it. They return and acquaint Mr. Speaker, That the Governor figurated he would receive the Address immediately in the Conference Chamber.

Ordered, That Mr. Carroll and Mr. Bracca do present the Address, The House adjourns till the Morrow Morning at YIII of the Clock.
