## M O N D A Y, April 17, 1758.

To his Excellency HORATIO SHARPE, Esq; Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Province of MARYLAND:

The humble ADDRESS and REMONSTRANCE of the House of DELEGATES.

May it please your EXCELLENCY,

**W**E beg Leave to assure your Excellency, that nothing less than the Regard we owe to the Preservation of the Lives, Liberties and Properties of the good People of this Province, could induce us to trouble you with a Representation so disagreeable to us, as what we are obliged to make to you, on the late March of Two Companies of the Militia, one from *Queen-Anne's County*, which we are informed were stationed at *Baker's Fort*, on the Western Frontier, for a considerable Time, and the other from *Kent County*,
