By the LOWER HOUSE of ASSEMBLY, May 3d, 1758.

May it please your HONOURS,

WE have considered the Amendments proposed by your Honours to the Bill, entituled, *A Supplementary Act to the Act, entituled, An Act for Granting a Supply of 40,000 l. for his Majesty's Service, and striking Thirty-four Thousand and Fifteen Pounds Six Shillings thereof in Bills of Credit, and Raising a Fund for sinking the same;* and altho' they do not seem to us in any Sort material or necessary, yet, in order that a Bill so Beneficial to the Province, may not be lost, we have agreed to the first Four of your Amendments; but cannot consent to the Mode of Recovery of the Fines and Penalties imposed by the Bill, as the
