Your Committee find, That no Money hath been paid into the Office in Virtue of the Act for Encouragement of able-bodied Freemen, voluntarily Enlisting in his Majesty's Service, for the Expedition against Cuba, since the Report in April Session, 1757; so that a Ballance of 684 l. 14 s. 6 d. still remains due to the Office for Money taken out by that Act, which was to have been replaced by Public Assessment.

Your Committee further find, that there remains due to the Office by the Act for purchasing Provisions for his Majesty's Forces for the Expedition against Canada, which is to be replaced by Ordinary Licences, the Sum of 147 l. 12 s. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ . That there remains due for Money taken out of the Office by the Act for his Majesty's Service, past in July, 1754, which is to be replaced by the additional Sum of Twenty Shillings on Ordinary Licences, the Duty on Servants, *Madeira* Wine, Wheel Carriages, Pedlars Licences, and the additional Duty on Negroes, 2055 l. 7 s. 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ . That there remains also due for Money taken out by the Act
