On Reading the Amendments made in the said Bill, the Question was put, That the following Proviso, *viz.* [Provided always, and be it Enacted, That nothing in this Act contained, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to the laying any Tax or Imposition on any Goods, Wares or Merchandizes, that are or shall be imported into this Province from Great-Britain,] be made Part of the said Bill. Resolved in the Affirmative.
