

entered by the Clerk of your House, since the Year 1757, tho' many of their Accounts appear to have been returned since that Time; and as there does, in some Instances, appear a Negligence in the said Clerk, in not entering some Accounts which have been rendered by the said Naval Officers, we cannot say whether the Naval Officers (whose Accounts do not appear) have been remis in their Duty, or whether such Accounts be lost or mislaid by the said Clerk.

Your Committee take Leave further to report, that we have received from your Committee of Accounts, the following Account, as delivered in by Benjamin Young, Esq; Naval Officer of the District of Pocomoks, with the Province of Maryland, as under stated; whereby he has given the Province Credit for the Interest that has arisen due on the several Sums of Money above set forth, as unpaid, for that District, from the Times they should have been paid, and that the Commissioners of the Loan-Office have certified from under their Hands, that the Bills of Exchange for the Sum of 147 l. 1 s. 3 d. Sterling, as mentioned in the said under stated Account, are lodged in the Loan Office, to be by them remitted to the Trustees in London, to the Credit of the said Province, by the first Opportunity; by which we apprehend the Province will be fully Indemnified.
