or Persons shall be any Way compelled to the Payment thereof, until the

First Dav of September following.

LXXXVIII. PROVIDED also, and be it Enasted, That before the said Collectors shall execute any Part of their Duty under this Act, they shall each of them enter into Bond, besore Two Justices of the Peace of their respective Counties, or One Provincial Magistrate, with good and sufficient Securities, such as the said Two Justices, or Provincial Magistrate shall approve, to the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of this Province, in the Sum of Three Thousand Pounds Current Money, with Condition to the faid Bond in the following Form, viz. The Condition of the above Obligation is such, That if the above bounden faithfully execute and perform the several Duties required of him by the Act of Assembly, entituled, An Act for granting a Supply of Forty Five Theuland Pounds for his Maj sty's Service, and for defraving the Expences heretofore incurred, for the Detence and Security of the Frontier Inhabitants of this Province, and for other Purpofes therein mentioned; and for raising the same by an equal Assessment upon all Estates real and personal, and lucrative Offices and Employments; and shall well and truly fay to the Commissioners or Trustees for Emitting the Bills of Credit established by Act of Affembly, the several Sums of Money, which he shall receive and be answerable for in Virtue of the same Act, at such Times as by the said Act is directed, according to the true Intent and Meaning thereof, then the above Obligation to be void, else to remain in full Force and Virtue. And the said Two Justices of the Peace, or Provincial Magistrate, shall immediately cause the said Bond to be proved before them or him, by the Witnesses thereto, and shall forthwith indorse the Probate on the Back thereof, and transmit the said Bond to the Clerk of the Provincial Court, who shall immediately record the same Bond and Indorsement aforesaid, in the Provincial Land-Records; and after Entry thereof upon Record, the faid Clerk shall deliver the original Bond to the Register of the Chancery Court, to be by him safely kept in the Chancery Office; and an attested Copy of the said Bond and Probat from the said Provincial Records, in Case the Original he lost cr destroyed, shall be as good Evidence in Law, to maintain an Action of Debt for the Breach of the Condition thereof, to all Intents and Purpofes, as if the said Bond or Bonds were actually produced and proved in Court.

IXXXIX. AND be it further Enacted, That the said respective Collectors shall pay to the Commissioners or Trustees, for Emitting the Bills of Credit established by Act of Assembly, the total Amount of the Sums charged on the said Certificates of Assembly, the Deductions and Allowances here after mentioned, being first made) by the Twenty-sisth Day of December there-
