MONDAY, April 19, 1762.

THE House met according to Adjournment: The Members were called, and all appeared as on Saturday, except Mr. Magruder, Mr. Selby, and Mr. Chaille. The Proceedings were Read.

Mr. Hanson brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker, a Bill, entituled, *An Act empowering the Justices of Charles County, to levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of Port-Tobacco Parish, in the said County, a Sum of Tobacco for the Uses therein mentioned*; which was Read the first and second Time by especial Order, and will Pass; and was sent to the Upper House by Mr. Hanson and Mr. Smallwood.

On Motion, Leave was given, to bring in a Bill for the Encouragement of Jonas Green, of the City of Annapolis, Printer:

Ordered, That Mr. John Hall, Mr. Johnson, and Mr. Grabame, do prepare and bring in the same.

A Bill, entituled, *An Act for the Naturalization of Colonel Henry Bouquet and Frederick Victor*, was sent to the Upper House by Doctor Steuart and Mr. Worthington.

Stephen Bordley, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker, the following Bills:

A Bill, entituled, *An Act to enable William Clajon and Mary his Wife, Administratrix of the Last Will and Testament of Gamaliel Butler, to sell a Lot of Ground, and three Dwelling-Houses, situate in the City of Annapolis, for the Payment of the Debts of the said Gamaliel Butler*;

A Bill, entituled, *An Act to change the Name of Zaccheus Barrett to that of Onion*;

A Bill, entituled, *An Act to remedy an Omission in the Last Will and Testament of Henry Woodward*;

Severally thus Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, 19th April, 1762. Read the second Time and will Pass."

Which said Bills were here Read, and Passed for Ingrossing.

On Motion, the Question was put, That Three Hundred able-bodied Men, be levied, paid and cloathed, for his Majesty's Service, agreeable to his Majesty's Requisition, signified by the Secretary of State's Letter, and also that Eighty-four Men be raised and levied, for Recruiting his Majesty's Regiments under the Command of his Excellency Sir Jeffery Amherst, his Majesty's General, agreeable to his Majesty's Requisition, signified by the said General's Letter, and that the following Sums of Money be applied to defray the Expence thereof, to wit,

The Sum of Two Thousand One Hundred and Twenty-one Pounds, which now remains in the Loan Office, Part of the Sum of Money appropriated for Scalps and Prisoners by the Act for granting a Supply of Forty Thousand Pounds for his Majesty's Service,	} 2121 0 0
