The Address to the King's most Excellent Majesty, was Read the second Time, and Approved, and Ordered to be Ingrossed.

A Bill, entituled, *An Act to empower Mary Stansbury, Widow and Administratrix, with the Will annexed, of Tobias Stansbury, late of Baltimore County, to sell the Lands therein mentioned, for the Payment of the Debts of the said Tobias Stansbury;*

A Bill, entituled, *An Act to establish a Market, at the Market-House in Chester-Town, in Kent County, and for the Regulation of the said Market;*

A Bill, entituled, *An Act for the better securing the Duty of One Shilling and Three Pence per Hoghead of Tobacco, imposed by an Act for emitting and making Current 90,000 l. Current Money of Maryland, in Bills of Credit, and all other Monies received by the Naval Officers belonging to the Public;*
