

Mr. Charles Grahams appeared in the House.

On Motion, ORDERED, That Mr. Grahams be added to the Committee appointed for inspecting the Accounts and Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Paper Currency Office, &c.

ORDERED, That Mr. Smallwood be added to the Committee for inspecting into the State and Condition of the Arms and Ammunition, and Accounts relating thereto.

The Bill, entitled, *An Act for the Advancement of Justice*, was Read the second Time, and Indorsed, "will pass."

Mr. Muddock brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following Report, viz.

By the Committee appointed to consider of and report to the House, what Funds may be necessary to be raised for erecting and establishing a College within this Province. October 13, 1763.

YOUR Committee are of Opinion, that the House in the City of Annapolis, which was intended for a Dwelling House for the Governor of this Province for the Time being, be completely finished, and made Use of as the College proposed to be established within this Province: The Expences of which, together with the Charges that will attend building the Out-houses, Gardens and Yards, and purchasing necessary Furniture, your Committee conceive will amount, as per the following Estimate, to £.3000.

For defraying the Expences whereof, your Committee give it as their Opinion, that the above Sum of £.3000 be taken out of the Money now belonging to the Province in the Hands of the Commissioners of the Loan Office.

And your Committee are of Opinion, that the annual Expence of supporting the said College, so as to give the Masters proper Encouragement, will amount, as appears by the following Estimate, to £.1360.

A President or first Master's Salary a Year,	300
Second third and fourth Master's each £.200 per Annum,	600
One Mathematical Master,	200
Two English and Writing Masters at £.100 each per Annum,	200
Five Servants and a Boy,	60

For defraying of which annual Expence, your Committee take Leave to recommend to the Honourable House, the following Funds:

A Tax on Ordinary Licenses in Annapolis, £.6, elsewhere £.3:10,	600
A Tax on Batchelors 5 s. to 20 s.	420
The Honourable Benedict Calvert, Esq; his Donation to King William School, at least,	40
Profits arising on 80 Boys at £.4 per Annum,	320

Your Committee also propose, that over and above the said Funds, two Persons at least in each County be impowered to take in Subscriptions to be applied in any Manner that shall be thought most expedient (by the Bill) for the Use and further Improvement of the said College.

All which is submitted to the Consideration of the Honourable House.
