New-York, 7th September, 1763.

SIR,

HAVE already sent Orders to the Commanding Officers at the several Posts, to stop all Traders from carrying any Supplies to the Indians; but as I think this of the utmost Consequence, I must request you will be pleased to give the necessary Directions for stopping all Kind of Commerce with any of the Tribes of Savages from your Province; for I suspect there are People mad enough, for the Sake of Gain, that would venture, notwithstanding the present Disturbances, to carry Supplies to the Indians; and I know of nothing that can tend more effectually to crush the Barbarians than the Prohibition of Trade; as they certainly cannot carry on their Hostilities much longer, unless they do receive fresh Supplies, and they have no Way of getting these Supplies but from us.
