

Your Committee find the Ballance of 686 l. 14 s. 6 d. is still due to the Office, for Money taken out of it, by the Act for Encouragement of able-bodied Freemen voluntarily Enlisting into His Majesty's Service, for the Expedition against Cuba; which was to have been replaced by Public Assessment.

Your Committee also find, that there is now due on Bond and Mortgage for principal Money, the Sum of £. 6475 16 8 $\frac{1}{2}$, and for the Interest due thereon, to the End of the last Year, of the several Bonds, the Sum of £. 817 14 11 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Your Committee find, on enquiring into the Ballance of 96 l. 6 s. 3 d. reported last Session to be due from *John Cook*, late Sheriff of *Prince-George's* County, that the Committee in the Year 1756, made a Mistake in saying there was due from the said *Cook* 47 l. 5 s. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for Ordinary Licences in 1753, as that Sum appears to have been included in the said Ballance of 96 l. 6 s. 3 d. which Mistake being rectified, and the said *John Cook* making it appear to your Committee, that Part of the Ordinary Licences charged to him in the Year 1746, and before they were required by Law to be paid down, was not received by him, but put into the Hands of *William Mauduit*, the succeeding Sheriff, to collect, and that there were other Errors in the List of Ordinary Licences returned that Year, by double Charges, and otherwise, to his Prejudice, to the Amount of 19 l. 8 s. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. and that there is really due from the said *John Cook* no more than 29 l. 11 s. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.

Your Committee have, during the present Session, Counted and Burnt the Sum of 10573 l. 36 s. 6 d. Part of the Money received in virtue of the Act for granting a Supply of Forty Thousand Pounds for his Majesty's Service, and striking Thirty-four Thousand and Fifteen Pounds Six Shillings thereof, in Bills of Credit, and raising a Fund for sinking the same, which they have placed to the Credit of Iron Chest N^o 2, as per the following State thereof, compared with the Day-Books, and several Vouchers from which the said Account is raised, and closed to the 22d Day of November, 1763; will appear.
