And the following Letter, viz.

SIR,

SARDOINE, *New-Castle*, River *Delaware*, 22^d October, 1765.

IN Consequence of Applications made to me, by the respective Governors of *New-Jersey* and *Pennsylvania*, I have taken the Stamp Papers for these Provinces, on board his Majesty's Ship *Sardoine*, under my Command, till a Place of Safety could have been provided for them; and understanding there were also some for *Maryland*, brought by the same Ship (*Royal Charlotte*) and imagining your Honour had not the Opportunity of making the same Application to me, I therefore, as it related to his Majesty's Service, and out of Respect to you, have taken them also on board me, and beg your Directions for the Disposal of them, as soon as possible.
