By the UPPER HOUSE of ASSEMBLY, November 14, 1765.

GENTLEMEN,

HIS is attended with two Petitions from Baltimore and Worcester Counties, desiring that the Inhabitants of those Counties may be relieved from the great and heavy Charge arising

from the Allowances made for the Maintenance and Support of the Poor.

The Burthen occasioned by our present Method of providing for the Poor, is generally selt and complained of, and we could wish to see some better Regulation of this Matter, universally introduced into this Province. Upon having Recourse to the last Year's Levy Lists, returned to the Clerk of the Council, for Ten Counties only, (the Returns from the Counties of Frederick, St. Mary's, Worcester, and Queen-Anne's, not having yet been made,) we find the Amount of the Poor's Rate therein, including Sheriff's Commission, to be One Million Three Hundred Seven Thousand Six Hundred and Forty-two Pounds of Tobacco.

Whether the Erection of Work-Houses, and Houses of Correction, in all the Counties, would not give great Relief to the Inhabitants in the annual Levies, afford a more regular and beginning applied Provision for the Poor, check the Disorders committed by common Beggars and idle

nds, and lay a Foundation for useful Industry, we refer to your Consideration.

Also to enquire into, and Report, the annual Amount of all Duties, Imposts, and Sums received and collected by the faid Lord Proprietary, or his Officers, for his Use, by or under Colour of Laws or Customs of this Province, for the Support of his Government here, distinguishing the same under proper Heads; and their Opinion, Whether the Application of all the Monies, To collected, ought not, by regular Accounts, to be made apparent to the Public.

Mr. Earle, Mr. Hanson, Mr. Harris, and Mr. Beall, be a Committee for that Purpose; and that they make Report thereof to the House.
