

by the said Court, revoke and make void the said Deeds and Conveyances, to buy and maintain the said Land and Negroes of his said Son's Widow, and did direct that the said Negroes, Horses, and Cattle, Plantation Implements, and Utensils, should be sold as soon as conveniently might be, and the Money which should be raised thereby, applied and reckoned as Part of the Estate of his Estate, devised to his said Son; and that his House and Land, situated in the said County, should also be sold by his Executors, or the Survivor of them, if any of the Executors of them should judge it most expedient and advantageous for the Benefit of his said Son, and the Money arising by the Sale thereof, should be also reckoned as Part of his Personal Estate, and paid out at Interest for the Benefit of his said Son. That the said Executors, or one of them, did, after the Death of the said Samuel Ogle, Esq; sell the said House and Land in Prince-George's County, under the Power given them by the said Will. That the Lands mentioned in the Petition, are not particularly mentioned in the said Will; but that the said Samuel Ogle died abroad of them. And that it does not appear to your Committee, that any Profits have been drawn from them, since the Death of the said Samuel Ogle, Esquire.

All which is humbly submitted to the Consideration of the House.

The Bill entitled, *An Act for the speedy Payment of sundry Persons several Sums of Money allowed to them on Account of the late War, with the List therein referred to*, (which was Read and Assented to by this House;) were sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Worthington, and Mr. Edward Gantt.

Daniel Dulany, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker, the Bill entitled, *An Act to prevent the Navigation on Potowmack River, Monokasy, and Great Comococheague Creeks, being obstructed*; Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, November 23, 1765; Read the second Time, and will Pass, with the following Amendment: Leave out after the Word *Act*, "in the 21st Line of the 1st Page, the following Words, *viz.* And may, from and after the first Day of October next, so pull down, prostrate, and destroy, any Dam already in Being, in either of the said Creeks, to which a sufficient Lock, as aforesaid, shall not then be fixed and built; and insert in the Place thereof the following Words, *viz.* And also may, after the End of this present Session of Assembly, pull down, abate, prostrate, and destroy, any Fish-Dam already in Being in the River aforesaid, or in either of the said Creeks.

Benedict Calvert, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker, a Petition of John Lanham, a languishing Prisoner in Frederick County Goal: Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly; Referred to the Consideration of the Lower House of Assembly;" Which Petition was here Read, and Ordered to lie on the Table.

The Petition of the Rector, Vestry-men, Church-wardens, and Parishioners of St. Andrew's Parish, in St. Mary's County, praying Leave to have a Quantity of Tobacco assessed, in not less than Three Years, to be applied to the Building a Parish Church, and other Purposes, was Read and Granted.
