Your Committee have also examined the Returns and Payments of the several Officers and Collectors of the Funds under the Act for granting a Supply of 40,000 l. for his Majesty's Service, and striking 34,015 l. 6 s. thereof in Bills of Credit, and raising a Fund for sinking the same; and find the following Deficiencies, viz.

The Collector of the Excise of Baltimore County, has rendered no Account, or paid any Money for Excise on Liquors, from the 25th of March, 1763, to the Expiration of that Law; nor did he collect more than 10 l. 11 s. 1 d. for the Half-Year next preceding, in the said County.

And the Sheriff of Prince-George's County has not accounted for the Batchelors Tax for the Year 1763.

The Collector of the Land-Tax of Frederick County, has not paid the last Year's Land-Tax, ending September 29, 1763: Nor the Collector of the Land-Tax for Queen Anne's County, the last Half Year's Land-Tax, ending September 29, 1763, which is 73 l. 17 s. 2 d. by Account lodged in the Office.

The Collector of Excise for Kent County, has rendered no Account, or paid any Money for Excise, from March 25, 1759, to November in that Year, or for Wheel-Carriages in 1757.

The Sheriff of Calvert County owes the Batchelors Tax for 1759.

The Sheriff and Collector of the Excise and Land-Tax of Cecil County, have rendered no Accounts, nor paid any Money for Wheel-Carriages in 1755, and 1756; or for Billiard-Tables, and Batchelors Tax, in 1756, and 1757; or for Excise, and Land Tax, from June 1756, to November 1757.

Your Committee, on examining the State of the Bills of Credit under the Act for emitting and making current 90,000 l. find, that there is yet a Sum of 4502 l. 8 s. 4½ in said Bills of Credit, not brought in to be sunk, as by the following State will appear.
