Your Committee beg Leave further to observe, that it appears by Reports of the Committee, May 17, 1748, and September 17, 1756, they had Information from Mr. Nicholas Hyland, that there was then in the Hands of the W dow and Executrix of William Rumfey; late of Cacil County, as faid Mr. Hyland was informed, near 100 l. remaining of the 30 per Taxable delivered out to the sveral Counties, which the said Widow was ready to pay, when required: And it does not appear to your Committee, that the said Sum hath ever been paid into the Office: And your Committee also observe, that regular and satisfactory Accounts have not hitherto been returned from several of the Counties, of such Money: And they apprehend there may be still Balances found due from many of them, on those Monies, were proper Enquiry made therein.

All which is submitted to the Consideration of both Houses of Assembly, this 29th of Novem-
