fert the Names of Thomas Hicks Newton, Richard Freeman, and William Morgan, of Calvert County, and Nathan Joyce, and Shepherd Grimes, of Anne-Arundel County; and have Amended the Bill accordingly: But, as to Henry Heinzman, John Berry, and John Davis, of Frederick County; and George Bell, of Prince-George's County, which should be Baltimore County; we cannot concede to the Amendments proposed, as we are not apprized of any Circumstances to merit the Interposition of the Legislature in Favour of those Petitioners: On the contrary, we are informed, that the Principal Creditor, at whole Instance Henry Heineman is now detained, hath offered to take his Bond for his Claim, and discharge him from Goal, which Heinzman hath resused: That John Berry is now, and for some Time past, hath been discharged out of Prison, and suffered to go at Large: That John Davis hath been guilty of a Riot in the Goal, and is detained on that Account, as well as for Debt; and that George Bell is strongly suspected of having acted fraudulently towards his Creditors; and no Recommendation of the faid George Bell's Petition by the Magiftrates in his County, appears to this House; nor does it in any Manner appear to us, that the Creditors of the said George Bell hath any Notice of his Petition. We therefore hope your Honours Concurrence with the Bill as now returned to you for that Purpose. M. MACNEMARA, Cl. Lo. Ho". Signed by Order,
