Which was here Read the First Time and Ordered to lie on the Table.

An Ingrossed Bill, entitled, *An Act for the Building a Vestry House at Chester Church, in Kent County, and Inclosing the Church Yard, and for other Purposes*: Was Read and Assented to, and sent to the Upper House with the Paper Bill by *Col. Lloyd*, and Mr. *Grahame*.
