OUR Committe find, by an Account from the Trustees in London, dated the 30th of May last, that there was then 26,800 l. Capital Stock in the Bank of England, belonging to the Province, which cost 33,357 l. 12 s. 6 d. and 135 l. 2 s. 10 d. a Balance not invested. That all the Bills of Exchange drawn by the Commissioners to fink the late Paper Currency, had been paid and charged in the Trustees Account, excepting only Ten Bills, amounting to 1,199 l. 17 s. 7 d.

That the Commissioners have remitted to the said Trustees, Bills of Exchange to the Amount of 10,929 l. 195.  $10\frac{1}{2}d$ . of which 4634 l. 75. 11 d. have been received by the said Trustees, and passed to the Credit of the Province; the remaining Sum of 6295 l. 115.  $11\frac{1}{2}d$ . not having come to hand; and, that the Trustees have, since the last Report, accounted for the Sum of 848 l. 95. 9 d. remitted by the Naval Officers.
