Your Committee find, by the Books in the Office, the following Perfons still indebted by Bond and Mortgage, viz.

And your Committee find, that the Commissioners have, fince November Session 1765, drawn Bills on the Trustees in London, for 108 l. 4s. 9d. Sterling, for the Sinking of 144 l. 6s. 6d. in Bills of Credit, brought in, to the 30th of April last, which said Bills of Credit have been, during this present Session, counted and burnt by your Committee, and that there now remains in the Office, 10 l. 5s. 2d. in Silver.

Your Committee have also burned all the Counterfeit Bills of Credit, which they found lodged in the Office.

Your Committee find, that the Monies reported in November Session 1765, and in several preceding Sessions, to be due from the several Sherists, on the Act for Encouragement of Jonas Green, passed in September 1756, and for Ordinary Licences, are still unpaid; and that nothing has been received from the several Officers and Collectors of the Funds, under the Act for granting a Supply of 40,000 l. for his Majesty's Service, &c. and who were reported to be deficient in their Duties, at November Session 1765, excepting only 72 l. 16 s. 6 d. from T. Prather, Collector of the Land-Tax for Frederick County, which Sum he had paid in Part of one whole Year's Land-Tax for that County, ending the 29th of September 1763; and your Committee have counted the said Sum of 72 l. 16 s. 6 d. in Bills of Credit, and burnt the same.
