

The Report brought in by W. Mordaunt, Esq. on the 15th Instant (from the Committee appointed) Was Read the second Time, and the House unanimously concurred with the Subject Matter therein reported, and Ordered, That the said Committee be continued as such, and that they make a final Report to the Lower House, at the next Session of Assembly.

On Reading a second Time, the Report from the Committee appointed to enquire and Report to the House, by what Law or Custom the Lord Proprietary of this Province receives the Fines, Forfeitures, and Amercements, arising in the Courts of Justice, and also the 12d per Hoghead on all Tobaccoes exported out of this Province, the annual Amount of such Fine, Forfeitures, Amercements, and Twelve-pence per Hoghead, for the last Seven Years, to what Uses and Purposes the same have been applied, with their Opinion as to the Justice of such Receipt and Application, and that the said Committee have Power to send for Persons, Papers, and Things, necessary to perfect their Inquiry and Report. The House Unanimously concurred therewith, and Resolved, That the Honourable Speaker, Mr. James Tappan, Mr. Mordaunt, Mr. John Hill, of Maryland, Mr. Thomas Tubb, Mr. Knyff, Mr. Cook, Mr. Francis, Mr. Worthington, Mr. Graham, and Mr. John Hill, of Baltimore, of the major Part of them, be, and are hereby appointed a Committee to conduct and finish the said Inquiry; and, for that Purpose, they are requested by this House, to meet at the City of Annapolis, at some convenient Time, in the Week, when they will have no Interruption from the Public Business, and make such further Resolutions respecting the 12d per Hoghead, as they shall think necessary to enable them to report fully their Opinion, and the Reasons whereon the same is founded, to this House, at the next Session of Assembly.

And whereas, to make a full and satisfactory Enquiry and Report on the above Matter, it seems requisite, that a thorough Examination and Inspection be made into all the Acts that have been passed, and Resolves that have been made, relative to the Revenue, and every Branch thereof, and raising and levying Money upon the People in any Manner whatsoever, towards improving the executive Power of Government, together with the corresponding Journals and Proceedings, not only of this House, but also of the Upper House, and Governor and Privy Council. It is therefore further Resolved, That the said Committee have free Access to all Papers, Books, and Records, in any of the Public Offices, to search and examine the same, and take Copies of any Part thereof, that they shall please. And also, That the said Committee have Power to employ a Clerk, who shall have the same daily Allowance as such Clerk in Session Time have, and that this House will take Care that the said Committee be indemnified for any reasonable Expence that may be incurred in prosecuting said Inquiry.
