

And the Bill, entitled, *An Act to oblige Infected Ships, and other Vessels, coming into this Province, to perform Quarantine*: Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, Dec. 5, 1766: Read the First and Second Time, and, with the following Amendments, will Pass, viz. In the 8th Line of the First Page, Leave out the Word, "Twenty," and insert in its Place, the Word, "Thirty." In the 7th Line of the Second Page, after the Word, "recovered," insert the Words, "with full Costs of Suit,"

By the UPPER HOUSE of ASSEMBLY, Dec. 5, 1766.

GENTLEMEN,

WE have returned the Bill, entitled, *An Act of Gratitude to the Right Honourable William Pitt, Earl of Chatham, and the Right Honourable Charles Pratt, Lord Cambden*, with a Negative, because you have thereby assumed the exclusive Right of appropriating or applying a Sum of the Public Money, expressly by Law subject to the Disposition of the General Assembly. If you will frame a Bill for the Purposes of that which we have rejected, in a Manner consistent with our Rights, we shall be willing to give our Assent to it.
