John Beale Bordley, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker, a Bill, entitled, *An Act to prevent the Exportation of Flour, Staves and Shingles, not merchantable, from the Town of Baltimore, in Baltimore County; and to regulate the Weight of Hay, and Measure of Grain, Salt, Flax-seed, and Fire-wood, within the said Town*; indorsed: "By the Upper House of Assembly, June 6, 1768: Read the first Time, and ordered to lie on the Table. Signed by Order, U. SCOTT, Cl. Up. Ho."

"By the Upper House of Assembly, June 9, 1768: Read the second Time, and will pass. Signed by Order, U. SCOTT, Cl. Up. Ho."

Which Bill was read here, and passed for ingrossing.
