Thomas, Mr. Paca, and Mr. Ringgold, are appointed a Committee to consider that Part of his Excellency's Speech, relative to the Criminal Laws, and report their Sense thereon to the House.

On reading the second Time, the Bill, entitled, *An Act for Recovery of certain Amerciaments, and also upon Defaults on Executions*; the Question was put, Whether the following Clause be added, viz. "Provided always, That in all Actions of Trespass upon the Case, where no Declaration shall be sent with the Writ, expressing the true Cause of Action, the Sheriff or Coroner shall not be amerced upon such Writ, above the Sum of Eight Thousand Pounds of Tobacco; and that the Judgment for such Amerciament shall be absolute, without any Assignment of the Cause of Action to be offered or tendered to the said Sheriff or Coroner?" Resolved in the Affirmative.
