**T**HE House met according to Adjournment.

The Members were called, and all appeared as on Yesterday, except Mr. Key.

The Proceedings of Yesterday were read.

Mr. Hanson, Mr. Smallwood, Mr. Ware, Mr. Gantt, and Mr. Gresham, have Leave of Absence.

The Question was put, Whether the Bill, entitled, *An Act for Recovery of certain Amerciaments, and also upon Defaults on Executions*, do pass? Resolved in the Affirmative. Sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Baker, and Mr. Cresap.

Mr. Ringgold brings in, and delivers to Mr. Speaker, the Bill, entitled, *An Act for granting to the Nanticoke Indians, a Compensation for the Lands therein mentioned*, amended according to the Order of the House: The Question was then put, Whether the said Bill do pass? Resolved in the Affirmative. Sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Allen, and Mr. Gale.

On reading the second Time, the Bill, entitled, *An Act to prevent any Obstruction of the Navigation in the River Patowmack*, the Question was put, Whether the said Bill do pass? Resolved in the Affirmative. Sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Baker, and Mr. Cresap.

On Motion, ORDERED, That a Bill be brought in for appointing new Visitors to the Public School in Frederick County, and for other Purposes therein mentioned; and that Mr. Jennings, Mr. Cresap, and Mr. Chase, do prepare and bring in the same.

On reading the second Time, the Bill, entitled, *An Act for the Preservation of the Breed of Fish*; the Question was put, Whether the said Bill do pass? Resolved in the Affirmative. Sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Baker, and Mr. Cresap.

Mr. Ridgely delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Petition of Charles Ridgely, Jun. Benjamin Rogers, Jonathan Plowman, William Aisquith, and Christopher Carnan, of Baltimore County, complaining of an undue Election of Mr. Thomas Cockey Deye, one of the Members for said County.

Which was read, and ordered to lie on the Table.

The Address to his Excellency, read a second Time, approved of, and ordered to be ingrossed.

Mr. Johnson brings in, and delivers to Mr. Speaker, the ingrossed Address to his Excellency, which is read, assented to, and signed by Order of the House, by the Honourable Speaker.

ORDERED, That Mr. Hall, and Mr. Hayward, do wait on his Excellency, and acquaint him, that this House hath prepared an Address to be presented to him, and desires to know when and where he will be pleased to receive it. They return, and acquaint Mr. Speaker, they delivered the Message; and that his Excellency was pleased to signify he would receive it immediately in the Conference Chamber.

ORDERED, That Mr. Goldsborough, and Mr. Gantt, do wait on his Excellency, and present the Address.

On Motion, Leave given to bring in a Bill, entitled, *An Act for amending and declaring the Law in the Cases therein mentioned*: ORDERED, That Mr. Hollyday, Mr. Johnson, and Mr. Hall, do prepare and bring in the same.

The House resumed the Consideration of the Petition of John Hammond Dorsey; and, after examining several Witnesses at the Bar of the House, referred the same for a further Hearing Afternoon.
