The ingroffed Bill, entitled, An Act to remedy the Inconveniencies arifing from the Loss of some Proceedings in St. Mary's County Court, read, and assented to, and sent, with the Paper Bill, to the Upper House, by Mr. Gantt, and Mr. Ward.
