" in this Act contained, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to establish, or in any Man-" ner affect any Judgment, that hath been entered, on which any Writ of Error, or Appeal, " hath been profecuted, or is now depending; but that fuch Judgment shall be considered, in

" all Respects, as if this Act had not been made, or be construed to affect any Person, or Per-" fons, that hath, or have purchased, any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, bona fide, " and on good and valuable Confideration; but that fuch Purchafer, or Purchafers, shall be, " and remain in the same State, Right, and Condition, as if this Act had not been passed."

Add also the following Clause:

" This Act to continue for, and during the Space of Three Years, and to the End of the " next Session of Assembly, which shall happen, after the Expiration of the said Three Years." The House adjourns till 11 o'Clock.
