POST MERIDIEM. The House met according to Adjournment.

The ingrossed Bill, entitled, *An Act for the Relief of the Reverend John M'Pherson, of Charles County:*

*An Act for the Relief of certain languishing Prisoners, in the several Jails therein mentioned: And, An Act for licensing Ordinary-Keepers, Hawkers, Pedlars, and Petty Chapmen:* Read, and assented to; and sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Selby, and Mr. Mackall.

The Message to the Upper House, read a second Time, approved of, and ordered to be ingrossed.

The ingrossed Message, read, and assented to; and sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Goldsborough, and Mr. Eden.

The Governor's Message of the 20th, read the second Time. ORDERED, That Mr. M. Tilghman, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Hall, Mr. Chase, Mr. Jennings, Mr. Ringgold, and Mr. Grabame, do prepare an Address to his Excellency, in Answer thereto,

Benedict Calvert, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker, the Bill, entitled, *An Act for the Relief of the Poor, within the several Counties therein mentioned;* indorsed: "By the Upper House of Assembly, June 16, 1768: Read the first Time, and ordered to lie on the Table.

Benedict Calvert, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker, the following Message:

By the UPPER HOUSE of ASSEMBLY, JUNE 21, 1768.

GENTLEMEN,

ANY Ordinance you may prepare for reimbursing his Excellency, the Money he advanced on Account of the *Nanticoke Indians*, and for an Allowance to Capt. *Pearis*, in Consideration of his Services to this Province, during the War, will meet with our ready Concurrence. We are also willing, that an Allowance be immediately made to Mr. *John Duckett*, for transcribing the Book you mention; if, at the same Time, you will agree to satisfy a Claim, Mr. *Rofs*, the late Clerk of this House, had on the Public, for a similar Service, by him performed, in pursuance of an Order of both Houses, in the Year 1739, and 1740, for which he was never paid; a Copy of which Account is herewith transmitted.
