On this Occasion, permit us to assure your Honours, that we shall never advisedly consent to any Fee being paid where no Service is done, and shall be still more averse to the Establishment of a Principle to inco spatible with political Regulation, as that of paying a Fine under the Name of a Fee, for the facile obtaining of Justice; nor can we imagine his Excellency the Governor would, as Chancellor, regard a triffing Loss ariting from the Passage of a reasonable Bill, which has been constantly been defired by the People for a long Course of Years.

For these Reasons we have returned your Honours the Bill, upon an Expectation that you

will recede from your First Amendment.

We also distagree to the Second Amendment, and think a Clause of Continuance unnecessary. We apprehend no Inconvenience can arise from more nearly conforming our Practice to the Laws of our Mother-Country, which have been long in Use and produced happy Effects; but till, should you think proper to give the Bill a Continuance for Three Years, and to the End of the next Session of Assembly thereafter, we are willing to pass it with that Amendment, and Signed by Order, not otherwise.
