## M O N D A Y, October 22, 1770.

THE House met according to Adjournment. The Members were called and all appeared as on Saturday, except Mr. Gantt, Mr. Contee, Mr. Deye, and Mr. Key. The Proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Johnson and Mr. Wootton appeared in the House.

Mr. Speaker communicated to the House, a Letter to him directed, signed C. Weisenthal: Which was ordered to be read, and it was read accordingly, and is as followeth:

## HONOURABLE SIR,

WAS ordered to appear, on Saturday next, at the Bar of the honourable the Lower House of Assembly, there to answer my signing a certain Petition, &c. I am, however, extremely forry that it is out of my Power to show my ready Obedience to the Commands of the he nourable House, since my Absence from Town, for the present, neight prove satal to several Patients now dangerously ill in this Town; therefore, whatever Displeasure I may have had the Misfortune to incur, I can assure the whole House, that I am to this Moment quite ignorant of the Contents of the said Petition, having never had Time, especially at the Time of Signature, to read it, on account of the Hurry. I am no leading Man of this Town, and it was a mere Accident that I figned it at all. As a Doctor, I was defired by the Town to have my Deposition taken concerning the Small-Pox, then under my Hands; and this was the Motive which brought me into this Town Meeting. After the finishing of this Business, the Petition was laid before me for figning, there seeing so many respectable Names before me already signed, and fuch Names, of whom I, as a Foreigner, must suppose that they know what ought to be done, as they are Natives of this Country. If then I have, without Intention, and even without knowing it, done amiss, I most humbly make my Submission, and beg the honourable House to overlook the Offence on the above recited Accounts.

By the UPPER HOUSE of ASSEMBLY, 221 of October 1770.

GENTLEMEN,

E have returned the Bill, entitled, An AA for amending the Staple of Tobacco, for preventing Frauds in his Mojesty's Customs, and for the Regulation of Officers Fees, with a Negative; but should you traink proper to consent to such Amendments, as may agree with the following Propositions, our Assent shall be given.
