## VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, SEPTEMBER 1770.

Conveyance is not agreeable to the Act of Assembly of this Province relative to the Enrollment of Conveyances; and on the same Ninth of November Seventeen Hundred and Forty-five, the faid Josiah Conant affigned over the faid Leases unto the faid William Thornton: That the faid William Thornton, on the Fifth of September Seventeen Hundred and Forty-Seven, by Beed, properly executed, acknowledged and recorded, for the Confideration of Four Hundred and Twentyeight Pounds Eleven and Sixpence Sterling, conveyed the fame Lands to the Petitioner and his Heirs: That the faid Abraham Barnes, the Petitioner, for about Twenty Years past, hath been, and now is in the actual and fole Possession of the said 1 ands, under and by Virtue of the Conveyance aforesaid, from the said William Thornton: That it does not appear whether the said Josiah Conant is dead with or without Heirs.

All which is humbly submitted to the Consideration of the honourable House.

William Hayward, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker the Petition of Jane Brown, of Cacil County, praying an Act may pass to empower her to sell Part of the Lands of John Brown, her deceased Husband, for the Payment of the Debts of the said John Brown: Which was read and ordered to lie on the Table.

On Motion, Leave given to bring in a Bill for more effectually preventing the buying and

felling of Offices.

ORDERED, That Mr. Tilghman, Mr. Chase, Mr. J. Hall, Mr. Johnson, Mr. W. Paca, and

Mr. Ringgold, do prepare and bring in the same.

The House referred the Order of the Day for taking into Consideration the Report from the Committee appointed to examine into the several publick Offices, and report the State and Condition thereof, for further Consideration To-morrow Morning.

The Order of the Day for taking into Consideration the subject Matter of the Motion from the Committee of Accounts, relative to the Treasurers Accounts, being read, the same is referred for Confideration To-morrow Morning.
